THE ST. ANDREW'S SOCIETY

The St. Andrew's Society of Washington DC is a charitable and social organization of men of Scottish birth or ancestry. It was organized on August 29, 1885 by William Robertson Smith, Superintendent of the United States Botanic Gardens. It was incorporated in the District of Columbia on May 18, 1908. In the national capital area, the present society replaced the St. Andrew's Society of Alexandria, Virginia, which was founded about 1780.

The objectives of the modern-day St. Andrew's Society of Washington, DC are to afford charitable and educational assistance to Scots, lineal descendants of Scots and widows of Scotsmen; to perpetuate Scottish traditions and culture; and to promote social activities among its members. The Society in furtherance of its first objective is the trustee of the Washington Scots Charity and Education Fund. This fund consists of contributions and bequests made by members and friends of the society and is regularly enlarged by proceeds of some of the Society's activities. Each year ten to fifteen thousand dollars in scholarships are awarded to deserving American and Scottish men and women pursuing studies here and abroad.

THE PIOBAIREACHD

Piobaireachd is Gaelic for "piping." Today it is most often used to designate *Ceol Mor* (Great Music), the classical music of the Highland pipe. *Piobaireachd* originated in the Middle Ages and flourished among the Gaelic-speaking clans of the Highlands until the rising of 1745. Its chief exponents were the MacCrimmons, hereditary pipers of the MacLeods of Dunvegan in the Isle of Skye. A *piobaireachd* consists of a theme played slowly and embellished with grace notes of increasing complexity through a number of repetitions. *Ceol Beg* (Little Music) is the modern form of piping and the one that today is most commonly heard. It includes marches, tunes to accompany Highland dancing, retreats and slow airs.
